4.0 PUBLIC HEARINGS

Oakley City Council

4.1 Oakley Executive RV and Boat Storage Phase 2 (CUP 03-16, DR 02-16) (Ken Strelo, Senior Planner)

Councilmember Hardcastle recused himself from hearing this item as he owns an RV and boat storage facility in Oakley and left the room until the item was heard.

Senior Planner Ken Strelo presented the staff report.

Councilmember Alaura inquired if the project will take two years to complete. She expressed concern with construction occurring for that length of time.

Mr. Strelo responded that the construction schedule is separate from the time the applicant must effectuate the approvals and staff does not anticipate that construction will take two years given the immediate demand for storage.

Councilmember Romick inquired if there is only one entrance off of Neroly Road and if at some future date an entrance might be placed off of Sandy Lane.

Mr. Strelo replied that there is an entrance off of Neroly Road and no gate off of Sandy Lane is planned at this time.

Mayor Higgins inquired why the spaces are being added now and not in 2011 when the other spaces were installed.

Mr. Strelo responded that in 2011 there was a conceptual plan for office space in the area where the spaces are to be placed.

Applicant and owner Bob Hayworth of Oakley Executive RV and Boat Storage explained that only larger spaces are available at this time and that in 2011 P&E only allowed one and one half megawatt of solar on the site and now that amount has increased; therefore, more spaces can be added now to accommodate more solar. He mentioned that he owns a construction company and the site is too small for the office he originally intended to have on the site for his company. He also mentioned that there is also greater demand for storage space at this time than he thought. With regard to the gate, he responded that an emergency access gate exists near Sandy Lane.

Councilmember Alaura inquired when construction will begin.

Mr. Hayworth replied that construction will begin as soon as he has permits and he does not anticipate more than six months of construction since most of the infrastructure is in place from the first phase.

6.0 REPORTS

6.1 CITY MANAGER

City Manager Bryan Montgomery announced City Hall will be closed beginning December 22 at noon and re-opening January 9. He added that the Police Department will be open during the closure and limited staff will be available during the closure for emergencies and inspections.

Mr. Montgomery introduced the following item to be heard and commented that the City Council would not be making a decision tonight as the City wishes to engage the public for input, but the City Council could provide feedback regarding some options for the site.

(a) Recreation Center Update (Lindsey Bruno, Recreation Manager)

Recreation Manager Lindsey Bruno provided a PowerPoint presentation to the City Council showing a couple of options for conceptual designs of the site including buildings, parking, recreation field space and existing modular buildings.

The City Council provided feedback that the second concept plan presented was preferred for purposes of traffic flow, having parking located away from the street, building visibility, safety of pedestrians and large assembly space,

Ms. Bruno also mentioned the Hometown Holiday Decorating Contest is taking place and encouraged everyone to cast their votes on the City's website.
