Oakley to Get Its Own Police Department

Former Police Chief Returns to Oakley

Since its incorporation, the City of Oakley has contracted for police services with the Contra Costa County Office of the Sheriff. While officers wear the City of Oakley uniforms and drive City cars, they are actually county sheriff deputies. After over a year of analysis, in April, the City Council voted to discontinue the City’s police services contract with Contra Costa County. While the City will continue to contract with the County for various related services, including dispatch and forensics, all sworn police officers will eventually become City employees.

Oakley is fortunate to be one of the safest cities in California, consistently making the list of top 50 safest cities by an independent review. The study and the decision to form our own police department were motivated by the desire to maintain Oakley’s excellent safety and service record. A locally-run police department allows the City to better determine how and where police services and administration can be improved or modified in order to maintain and increase service levels and control costs.

For example, in addition to the cost for each officer, Oakley also pays the County’s administrative expenses associated with each deputy the County provides. During the current fiscal year alone the increased costs were \$650,000 to maintain existing staff levels, but without additional officers.

Chief Chris Thorsen will be returning to Oakley to lead the transition from county-provided services, and to build the local City police department. Chief Thorsen served as Oakley’s police chief from 2005 to 2010 as one of his assignments with the Contra Costa County Office of the Sheriff. Chief Thorsen currently serves as the chief of police in Clayton.

“Chief Thorsen is an experienced and charismatic law enforcement professional that did an outstanding job previously here in Oakley and we look forward to great things from him again as he leads the newly-formed Oakley municipal police department,” stated City Manager Bryan Montgomery. Thorsen is expected to assume his new Oakley duties in early August.

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City Improvements

A partial list of the Capital Improvement Program Projects completed this year:

- Construction of storm-drain infiltration basins on Main Street between O'Neil Court and Seventh Street, ending a chronic flooding problem.
- Installation of flashing beacon signs, advanced electronic warnings signs, speed radar feedback signs, ADA curb ramp, pedestrian barricades, and striping through various parts of town.
- Modification to traffic signals and street lighting on Main Street and Empire Avenue to install new illuminated street name signs, pedestrian countdown clocks and push buttons.
- Conversion of over 2,000 street lights from high pressure sodium bulbs to energy-efficient light emitting diode street lights.
- Resurfacing of West Cypress Road from Empire Avenue to Rose Avenue, Big Break Road from Main Street to the marina, Rose Avenue from Main Street to Laurel Road.

Suicide Prevention

Oakley Residents Receive Crisis Intervention Training

Alarmed by an unusually high number of suicides experienced in 2014, local clergy convened by the *You, Me, We Oakley!* Program began to meet to learn how they could play a role in lowering such incidences.

Clergy from St. Anthony's Church, New Lifeline Ministries, Ebenezer Community Church, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and Bread of Life Churches began gathering in August of 2014 to develop a work plan with the goal of making training available for themselves, their membership, and the broader Oakley community in order to better recognize the warning signs of someone contemplating suicide and help refer them to crisis assistance.

In partnership with the Contra Costa Crisis Center, the *Safekeepers Initiative* was developed. At the conclusion of a series of three trainings, totaling 14 hours, participating community members would become certified *Safekeepers* with the opportunity to help individuals in crisis through the Contra Costa Crisis Center and locally. Trainings are free of charge and in English and Spanish.

Over 60 residents answered the call and have completed the first training. Their unselfish commitment and concern for their fellow residents have earned our admiration and thanks. City Council Meetings are Open to All

The Ralph M. Brown Act, authored by California State Assembly member Ralph M. Brown and passed in 1953, guarantees the right of the public to attend and participate in meetings of local legislative bodies. Because the City of Oakley adheres to the Brown Act, meetings of the City Council are open and public.

Additionally, agendas are posted in advance, the media is notified, anyone is welcome, non-disruptive recording is permitted, documents are public, and anyone can address the Council during public comment. Only in rare instances can a City Council discuss matters in closed session and these include topics such as pending litigation and labor negotiations. Plan to attend the next City Council meeting.

Desafortunadamente, durante el año 2014 Oakley vio un número alto de suicidios. En respuesta, convocados por el Programa *You, Me, We, Oakley!* el clero local comenzó a reunirse para aprender cómo pueden jugar un papel para reducir estas incidencias. Agradecemos a las Iglesias de San Antonio, New Lifeline Ministries, Ebenezer Community Church, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, y Bread of Life cuyos líderes se reunieron desde Agosto de 2014 para desarrollar un plan de trabajo con el objetivo principal de hacer disponible capacitación para sí mismos, sus feligreses, y toda la comunidad de Oakley con el propósito de que como comunidad sepamos reconocer las señales de alguien pensando en suicidarse y saber referirles a ayuda.

En colaboración con el Centro de Crisis de Contra Costa, la iniciativa de Safekeepers llegó a ser. Una serie de tres cursos de capacitación se ofrecerán. Se pide que participantes asistan los tres cursos. Una vez finalizado el proceso, estos miembros de la comunidad, podrán obtener la certificación de "Safekeepers" y se les ofrece oportunidades para poner su conocimiento en acción para ayudar a las personas en crisis a través del Centro de Crisis de Contra Costa.
